- Rotary International programme that facilitates intensive training for youth and young adult's ages 14 to 30 years old
- Talented young people attend a seminar, camp or workshop organised by Rotarians at the local or district level. District 7030 conducts a RYLA Conference once per year in one of the countries/territories within the District
- Each year more than 9,000 young people are **sponsored by Rotary Clubs throughout the world**. Rotary Clubs are dedicated to helping our leaders of tomorrow develop their leadership skills to the fullest. Those who complete the RYLA program are better able to successfully manage their own lives and careers and make a difference in the world.









### RYLA 2015 -16 objectives:

- to demonstrate Rotary's respect and concern for youth
- to encourage and assist young people in responsible and effective voluntary youth leadership by providing them with a valuable training experience
- to foster continued and stronger leadership of youth by youth
- to publicly recognize the many young people who are rendering service to their communities as youth leaders

### RYLA Grenada

In an effort to facilitate team building, different program delivery techniques, such as presentations, group work, activities, and other informal learning methods were utilized ensuring a balance of interactive and engaging program elements.

The program was delivered by a cadre of professionals who were leaders in their field and had the ability to relate to young people. A number of Rotarians served as resource persons.

Core areas of focus were: **leadership, citizenship,** and **personal development.** Presentations were made and discussions were held, each of one hour duration, on the following specific topics:

### RYLA Grenada Programme

### Evening Activities

The program included several opportunities for socializing and networking

- Movie Night: This event was held offsite at one of Grenada's s most popular entertainment spots for young people. There the participants interacted informally over eats, non-alcoholic beverages and a movie.
- Cultural Evening: Delegates got the opportunity to share and enjoy each other's culture through presentations by country. Participants utilized various art forms to showcase their culture: song, dance, drama, video presentations and poetry. This was followed by a sumptuous meal and music by a D.J. This activity was also held offsite.

### Community Project

Under the guidance of the Rotaract Club of Grenada, delegates headed to our rainforest to engage in tree planting.

At the end of the exercise, some eighty two trees were planted, sponsored by the Ministry of Agriculture.






### RYLA Grenada Attainment

- This activity formed part of the closing ceremony. Each group of delegates was required to do a five minute presentation that demonstrated the information gathered over the previous days. Participants were very creative and portrayed various aspects of leadership, citizenship, and personal development to which they had been exposed. Each group also composed a RYLA Pledge. The following is a sample of one of the pledges:
- For each of the 24 hrs represented by the cogs in the Rotary wheel, we as youth leaders promise:
  - 1. To be truthful
  - 2. To promote equality among our peers
  - 3. To be engaged for the benefit and good of all
- 4. And to strive to become agents of change who continuously ignite the fire of service in ourselves and the youth in our communities




## Open Ended Question...



# Training Experience



### Recommendations

The post review of RYLA 2015-16 highlights some area that can be considered for future RYLA's within the District 7030:

- consider hosting RYLA during the vacation period, when the availability of colleges and/or Universities will be available for accommodation in order to keep the cost of delegates at a min, since all related charges are made by the sponsoring club.
- have first-aid kits readily available in case that the reserved medical practitioner isn't readily available
- be innovate to encourage delegates interaction between sessions
- consider having important topics such as 'Financial Planning and Etiquette' presentations as plenary sessions
- invite the Master of Ceremony to attend last set of committee meetings to be familiar with the entire programme
- sponsoring club to set criteria for selecting delegates
