Saying Good Bye


We say good bye to our outgoing President Tim who in his own quiet unassuming way, led our club to its highest ever achievement in the Club's history.

### Welcome PE Selma 2016/2017





### The Rotary mean-it was present by Rotarian Joanna on May 6th.

Her presentation was about a speech make by RI President Ravindran WWW.rotary.org/office-president . The speech was about a project that a well-meaning development agency took on with the objective of improving water availability in a rural community in Kano plains Kenya.

At every stage it was assumed that the men knew the needs of the community, spoke for and represented it. This was far from the case as they later found out (when the projected came to a halt) that the women knew the needs of the community far better but their opinion was never sought. The project was a complete failure.

President Ravi emphasized that women should be part of the Rotary family in keeping with Rotary's policy on gender equality and that clubs that do not , lack two basic qualifications for Rotary membership: honesty and good sense.

He stressed that a club that shuts out women shut out half the talent, half the ability, and half the connections effectively.

Rotarian Joanna took this opportunity to commend the club for embracing women and providing them with equal opportunity for leadership roles in the
