

The training for this conference commences on the 30^{th} of January 2016 at the UN House, Balmoral Gap, Christ Church, and will continue for 5 consecutive Saturdays. Over the course of these 6 weeks, these young persons will be exposed to the world and work of the United Nation. UN diplomats and local officials will be dedicating their time to educate the students in international relations.
