We will also attempt to explore the possibility of an Adult Literacy Assistance Program.

In the words of Irina Bokova, 'Literacy is much more than an educational priority – it is the ultimate investment in the future and the first step towards all the new forms of literacy required in the twenty-first century. We wish to see a century where every child is able to read and to use this skill to gain autonomy'.

The Rotary Club of Antigua sees the youths as the future leaders of our Country. The success of any country hangs on the education and training given to the child leading to their future career path.

Hence, career exploration is important and will help the student to develop a clearer view of himself/herself.

Recognizing the importance of choosing the right career, Rotary Club of Antigua will seek to engage the services of Choices.

Choices will offer the students the Career Key, which is a simple self-assessment test that will help them to find the right career path, an essential tool to help the student identify his/her interests, skills, values, aptitudes and personality.

In continuing with the Theme-Rotary Serving Humanity", we will continue with our monthly Meals on Wheels Program. This program has been around in excess of 25 years whereby the Club members meet and package 100 food packages which are distributed to persons with little or no financial means,

The Sewing Machine Project currently in the communities of Greenbay, Freetown, New Winthorpes, Pigotts and Liberta will be extended next year to include another community. I must inject our thank you to the Belle Vue Breakfast Club and Kirkland Downtown partnering with us on this project.

We will also continue with the Medical Assistance Project and the annual Children Christmas Party in Antigua and Barbuda where we bring Christmas cheer to 500 children plus teachers.

These projects would not have been possible without the support of Corporate partners, supporters of the Club's fundraising activities and patrons of our major fundraiser 'Rotary Colours Fete.'

This year, signals the 9th year of Colors which will be held at Barnacle Point on July 16, 2016 under the theme 'Colors in Africa'. Tickets are available from any member of the Club, Dr. Cordner's Office, Flow and the office of Thomas John & Co.

It is from your support of projects such as these that Rotary Club of Antigua is able to assist the less fortunate in your community. Do continue to support.

In the area of Change, Rotary Club of Antigua will not re-invent the wheel but will expand the wheel by creating an even greater impact with the reintroduction of the Computers for the World Project and for the first time, the Club will undertake an Easter Fair, a project whereby we will attract 150 children across the island. and Rotary's Easter Bunny will present each child with an Easter Basket after they would have hunted for their Easter eggs.

The Club will also address Rotary International 2nd, 3rd and 4th area of focus-, Disease Prevention and Treatment, Water and Sanitation and Maternal and Child Health' through a simulcast with a TV/Radio Station to be announced.

This year Rotary International celebrates its 100th Anniversary of the Rotary Foundation.

It is important to know that Rotary has contributed over US\$1 billion and countless volunteer hours to immunize more than 2 billion children towards the eradication of polio. As a result of the unique partnership with UNICEF, the World Health Organization and Prevention, polio cases worldwide have decreased by 99%. Over 5million cases of paralysis deaths from polio have been averted. Polio is now only found in two countries, Afghanistan and Pakistan. Polio would be the only second human disease ever to be eradicated, and we are this close.

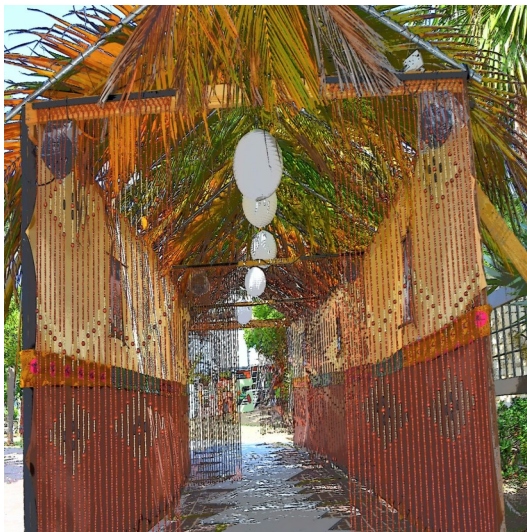

My goals for the year are as follows:

To increase membership by inspiring individuals to give back to others through community service

To foster deeper relationships with both our Rotary and Interact Clubs

To promote and increase the clubs visibility both locally and on a District Level by use of various social media outlets

To develop more partnerships with other NGO's in an effort to pool our resources and give more to those in need in the nation

To increase membership by inspiring individuals to give back to others through community service:

We plan to increase our marketing efforts to get the Rotaract Name out there. Everything we do, we plan to share it with the world through social media and local media outlets. It is my belief that if persons see the good work the club is doing and how much we give back to the community then this will attract persons to become a part of the club.

Recruitment and Retention Strategy

We would also work on recruiting more members by having scheduled membership drives at strategic locations to attract more persons (Epicurean, First Choice, College Fairs, etc) and in an effort to retain our current members there will be increased club socials and Ad Hoc events and the opportunity for all Rotaractors to be more involved in planning and organising club activities.

To foster deeper relationships with both our Rotary and Interact Clubs:

Last year was the first Schools Music Competition held under the leadership of Rotarian Omari Harrigan and it was executed by all 3 levels of the Rotary Family- Rotary, Rotaract and Interact. This project was a great initiative to bring the 3 clubs together and also allow young person's the opportunity to showcase their talent to the people of this nation. We hope to continue to work along with the Rotary Club to make this event even bigger and more spectacular than the previous one.

To promote and increase the clubs visibility both locally and on a District Level by use of various social media outlets:

The use of social media will continue, specifically Facebook and Instagram. It was also suggested during conference that Rotary Showcase can be used to market the club. This is an option we would explore as well. Also we will push even more to get our projects in local media. We've also tried once again to introduce a PRO to assist in the club's marketing efforts. The PRO for this year is Ariel Derrick who has a background in marketing.

To develop more partnerships with other NGO's in an effort to pool our resources and give more to those that are in need in the nation:

I believe that there is strength in numbers and collaborations. For the past 2 years the Rotaract Club of Antigua has partnered with the Antigua and Barbuda Red Cross for the Vector Borne Prevention and Information Project. The first year was great as we got to about 70 households in the Yorks Village with packages to assist in the prevention of the Dengue and Chikungunya Viruses. The second year, we were able to double that amount and give out over 200 prevention packages to two neighbourhoods on different sides of the island, those being Bolans and Golden Grove in an effort to combat the Zika virus and today we have a healthy relationship with the Antigua Red Cross.

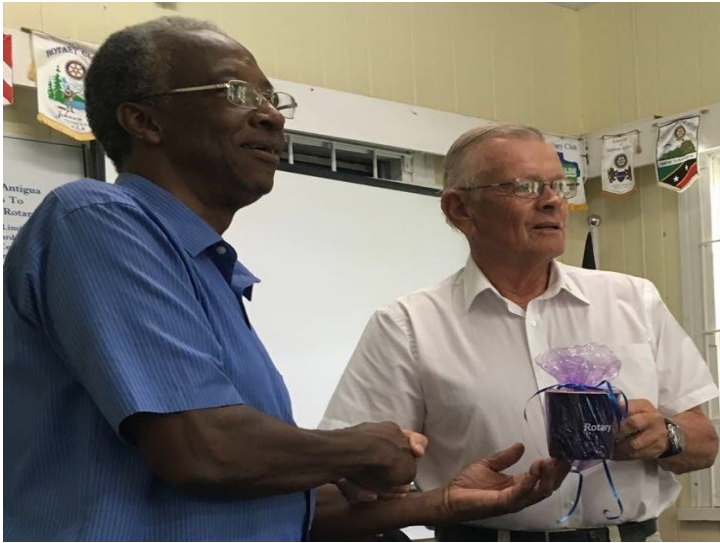
30th Anniversary Activities

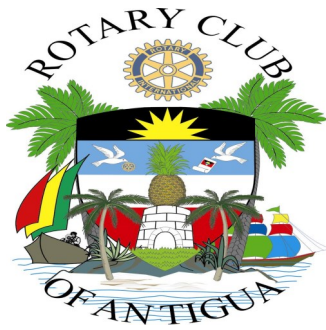
