A decision was taken to pay for his accommodation for eight days. He was met at the Airport by Rotarian Joseph Johnson and transported in a vehicle that was Wheel Chair friendly.

He was visited by the Doctor at the house on his arrival and subsequent visits to the Doctor were accommodated by use of the special vehicle. Our Club covered the cost of accommodation and transportation while he paid for his meals. He was accompanied by a nurse from Montserrat who paid her own expenses.
