

GEORGE ALLEYNE LIBRARY PROJECT ROTARY CLUB OF CENTRAL PORT OF SPAIN

On Wednesday 22nd March, the Rotary Club of Central Port of Spain officially launched the George Alleyne Library at the All in One Child (AIO) Development Centre, Beetham.

Named after former Rotarian now deceased George Alleyne, the small library consists of books donated by friends and families of the Rotarians.

George was not only an avid reader and lifelong student of literature, he was intimately involved with the school for many years and the club felt that the Library was the most

suitable way to honour his memory. His widow, daughters and granddaughter attended the launch and shared moving memories about George and his love of reading and learning with the children.

MP for Morvant, Adrian Leonce attended and read to the children. He appealed to them to read and become educated in order to make a positive change at home, in their communities and in their country. The Chairman of the AIO paid tribute to Rotary's contribution to the school over the years, and a



commemorative plaque incorporating George's picture was unveiled.

Among those in attendance were the head of the East POS Development Corporation; members of the IATF; a senior representative of NALIS (who ran a 1 year reading programme at the school) and the principal, teachers, pupils, parents, Board members and founder of the AIO.

Running Water!

Pres. Faraz Hosein, Rot. Kelvin Sookraj (Project Chair), PP Dev Gosine, PP Robert Sanowar, Sec. Candice Lalla, PP Decoursey Redman and PE Richard Persad. The Rotary Club of San Fernando South received a request via our Facebook page from a family in Lower Barrackpore, Trinidad seeking financial assistance for a water connection to their home located 600 feet off the main road. At the time, the household was without running water and electricity. The family's only source of water involved filling barrels from a remote standpipe and transporting them to their home in their car.

After a site assessment, it was decided that RCSS would provide all the materials required for efficient water supply and storage. As part recognition of RI's Water & Sanitation Month, a large team of our members visited the home on Sun. March 19th, 2017 and provided ALL the labour necessary to install 600 feet of poly tubing, 3- 400Gal water tanks, concrete blockbase, standpipe and plumbing connections.

The tanks were eventually filled with truck borne water. Apart from the extensive work involved with this project, both our Rotarians and the family members had a great deal of fun during the process. The project was chaired by Rot. Kelvin Sookraj and received significant support from our membership, both in person and in spirit. Connection of the tubing to the WASA line is expected to be completed by week's end. Additionally, RCSS is now working on obtaining electricity connection for the family next.

In signature RCSS' fashion, fellowship ensued for the remainder of the evening, celebrating the success of the project.




