On Saturday 5th November 2016, under the leadership of President Debbie Roopchand, the Club conducted its third distribution of basic monthly supplies to the children of the Cerebral Palsy Society of Trinidad and Tobago.

The distribution took place at the KPA Primary School, Chase Village where the Society meets on a monthly basis with its membership within a small classroom. Despite many efforts, the Society is yet to secure the use of a venue which is properly equipped to support their members' needs.

While the parents of the children of the Society continue to be faced with major challenges such as their inability to afford physical therapy, speech therapy, and daytime care for their children, many expressed their thanks to the Club for its assistance which allows for them to use the money they would have had to spend on these items towards other pressing needs for their children.



MORUGA BEACH CLEAN UP
