The schools were briefed on various aspects of Rotary International. Gladly, all the schools present stated their interest and commitment to starting Early Act at their schools.

This would be the first of its kind in St. Lucia.

Next step: Individual meetings with each school to adopt the Clubs constitution and bi-laws.

Topic – Eastern Caribbean Integration – Possibilities.

Dr Jules presented a very clear and structured approach for OECS integration. With Martinique now a member and Guadeloupe soon to join, the opportunities for the region would significantly improve. Major one was

the increase in population to \$1.5M, GDP to \$15B compared to TNT at \$18B. Some benefits of such integration:

- Region becomes more attractive for investments in terms of scale.
- Ability to negotiate more favourable prices
- ♦ Greater talent pool
- Better competitiveness and negotiating clout
- Wider market for sale of goods and services.
