MEET OUR GREETERS & GUEST SPEAKER

Past Secretary Neville LeRoy "Roy" Smith,

affectionately known to all as 'Roy' joined Rotary on November 01, 1976 when introduced by the then Secretary Mr. Fred Allen. Mr. Charles Toppin was the President at the time. This began Roy's 38 year career in the Rotary Club of Barbados during which he served as Treasurer, Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Vice President of the Club.



His favourite project, the Library project was executed in the presidency of PP Richard Blanchette, he assisted in the fundraising efforts of obtaining books

from overseas for donation to the Junior Library. His stint as Treasurer was through the year of the Barbados National Chain Link Project (Nov 30, 1979), another notable project for the Club.

When interviewed for Profiles in Community Service # 6 (**D.R. Douglin**) featured in the Rota News for July 21, 2014 he offered this advice to newer members of the Club - **"Make your**"

contribution to the community as that is what we are all about."

Currently Roy serves on the Attendance and Challenged and Senior Citizens Committees.

For his contribution to the community, Roy was awarded a Paul Harris Fellowship in 2001.

Past Director H. Waldo Clarke joined the Club on April 01, 2010 along with three other persons: Sanjay Amin, Mark Cox and Shawn Franklin. He was introduced by PP John Cabral. His classification is Manufacturing – Textured Coatings. In the year 2010-11, (9 months membership) January – June 2011, Waldo served out the term as Club Service Director for Neil Owen who was posted overseas.



He served as Director New Generations (now Youth Service) 2011-2013 and he returned to Club Service serving as Director for 2013-2015.

Currently he serves on the Guest Speaker and Classification, MUN and Youth Services Committees.

Waldo is the grandson of the late St. Clair "Clarry" Clarke, PHF.

Mrs. Angela Simpson attended Queens College and Albert College in Canada studying Business Administration although "I really wanted to



study Art. I left Canada in 1963 and was keen to go to Israel and live and work in a Kibbutz!"

Instead she returned home and started to work with Pan American. Married John Simpson in 1966 and worked with him in the majority of his ventures.


RED CROSS Fund Raising Dinner
