A unanimous decision was taken to request R.I. to establish a district of the non-districted clubs in the Caribbean, and eventually this led to the formation of District 404 in 1974 by R.I.



Peace and Conflict Project. Grace to be Born is a foundation that provides temporary shelter for struggling mothers and orphans. The Rotary Club of Makati, Philippines visited the Foundation to help these women and kids who needed a second chance in life. A seminar was given on the importance of self reliance and to keep hope even being in difficult situations.

Ping Yuen Peace Project



Bringing Rotary into low income housing and helping bring peace to discrimination issues that exist.

Rotary Club of San Francisco Chinatown served 250 residents in a low income housing area. Issues arise such as race and discrimination and also an increase in crime. As a member of the Rotarian Action Group, the Club was asked to organize a peace project. Residents were asked to attend a themed barbecue. Both Black and Asian residents were joined in harmony to mingle and have their meal together. The Club funded the BBQ and injected a Rotarian spirit into a struggling community.

Working with your Club Secretary on a monthly basis makes the entries easier to do. You have until 30th June 2017 to enter your Data on-line.

Once your Committees are achieving their goals and objectives set out at the start of the year, you will be in the driving seat to accomplish all four (4) citations where applicable.

Presidential Citations for Rotaract and Interact Clubs—The time-line is similar as stated above, which is 30th June 2017. Liaise with your Rota-

ract and Interact Presidents to ensure there is on-going planning, collaboration and communication amongst their members for the completion of service and fund raising projects and membership targets.

Public Image—This is easily missed by most clubs. Google to find it! This year our District 7030 will fall under Zone 34. Submission deadline is March 31, 2017. (Send completed citation to Betsy Owen, Rotary Public Image Coordinator for Zone 34 with details as indicated)

Club Recognition received from the District Governor can signal a successful year. Acknowledging individual and team support by members throughout the Rotary year in your clubs also provides members with inspiration to serve at higher levels in your Club and the District.
