

#### Economic and Community Development Month



#### A new weapon in the fight against polio

A modified polio vaccine, nOPV2, is offering new hope in the fight to eradicate polio. The reengineered formula has a lower risk of causing vaccine–derived poliovirus. This means it is less likely that the weakened strain of poliovirus used in the vaccine will mutate and spur outbreaks in communities where immunization levels are low.

The vaccine first rolled out in March 2021. In the first half of 2022, more than 370 million doses have been administered in more than 20 countries. <u>Read more</u> about what went into developing this vaccine or listen to the story on our Rotary Podcast.

# A modified vaccine offers hope that eradication is closer than ever



In mid-2017, two groups of 15 strangers lived together for 28 days each in a ring of shipping containers assembled in the parking lot of Antwerp University Hospital in Belgium. They had access to books and movies, a small courtyard for barbecues, a common kitchen and dining room, and a fitness room — all of it behind secure interlocking doors and under the watch of personnel in protective gowns.





# Rotary pledges \$150 million toward polio eradication



Rotary International President Jennifer Jones appeared on the main stage at the starstudded Global Citizen Festival on 24 September to highlight Rotary's commitment to eradicating polio and announce an additional \$150 million pledge toward that end. Jones spoke in front of 60,000 people in New York City and tens of thousands more online and on TV. Learn more about Rotary's most recent pledge in the fight against this disease.



#### **RYLA UPDATE (October 2022)**



Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) will simultaneously be held throughout District 7030. The presentations from Trinidad and other countries will be facilitated via the zoom platform in English and French, and the breakout sessions will be managed in each country. Further, the participants will be required to be present physically in their country.

The event is open to persons 16–24 years old and is being planned from Trinidad and Tobago. District RYLA is scheduled for **January 14 and 15, 2023.** 

Rotary clubs sponsoring 1 to 10 participants will be required to pay US\$50.00 and for 11 and more participants a registration fee of US\$100.00. Additionally, a contribution will be required to cover the expenses incurred for the in-person attendance. Your country's RYLA Supporting Team will determine this latter charge.

The RYLA Planning Committee will be meeting on Saturday, October 15, 2023 to discuss the programme which will be shared with the District when it is finalised. The registration link would be sent to you during the first week in November.

Let us encourage our future leaders to participate and have fun in our District RYLA event!!
